



Bathing Beach Ferch

📍 Dorfstr. 41a, 14548 Schwielowsee/OT Ferch

After a match on one of the beach volleyball courts, you can cool off in the clear water or relax on the bathing lawn. The really sporty ones might want to hire a kayak afterwards. The café pavilion, whose terrace overlooks the entire length of Lake Schwielowsee, serves tasty snacks.

Seaside resort Caputh

📍 Weg zum Strandbad 1, 14548 Schwielowsee/OT Caputh

Visitors can experience that South Sea feeling at the sight of the sandy beach, the Balinese sunbeds and the palm frond parasols. Exercise enthusiasts can burn off energy playing beach volleyball, SUP boarding or paddling, and afterwards they can meet up in the restaurant or at the cocktail bar. A surf school and yoga complete the programme.

Bathing Beach Glindowsee

📍 Jahnstr. 41, 14542 Werder (Havel)/OT Glindow

In addition to the sunbathing lawn, the wide sandy beach is also impressive. A children's playground keeps the little ones busy, while a beach volleyball court and boat hire offer variety for adults. Experienced swimmers can plunge into the water from the jetty.

Bathing Beach Werder (Havel) at Lake Plessow

📍 Am Plessower See 46, 14542 Werder (Havel)

It is a little hidden and can be reached from the steep bank of Lake Plessow via a long flight of steps. A bathing platform, a water slide and a snack bar await guests at the bottom. The lifeguard rents out sunbeds, parasols and badminton rackets.

Forest Beach Templin

📍 Templiner Str. 110, 14473 Potsdam

Picturesquely situated among the trees, the sunbathing lawn and sandy beach nestle on the shore of Lake Templin. The attraction: a large water slide with automatic timekeeping. There are also beach chairs, beach volleyball courts, play modules and a small swimming pond for children, a speedy ride on the fun banana and pedal boat hire.

Dream day with repetition factor

The Rode family spent a day in a raft boat on the Havel – including an "animal" encounter. Mum Viviane reports.

A day completely at one with the elements: first surfing with a paddle, later relaxing on the sun deck. And the wildlife stops by too.



When we "boarded" our boat in the morning, we were a little nervous about what the trip would be like. After all, we didn't need a boating licence and we were completely on our own for the tour. But the boat hire company gave us plenty of safety instructions, explaining how to control the speed with the gears, how to anchor, what the red and green buoys meant and which rules of right of way apply on the water.

"Steering our houseboat wasn't difficult at all!"

Dad Marcus took the wheel, and after a few metres he had the handling of our boat down pretty well. "Unlike a car," he said, but actually found steering and changing gear easy. Sofia was very impressed by his skills and realised that she hadn't even known her dad could do that. Soon we were out on the open water, under a railway bridge, past a busy campsite and on across the lake. Large excursion boats and smaller motorboats sailed past us, people waving from the deck. We were surprised to see so many beautiful houses and gardens on the shore. You don't usually notice them from the road. Then, just past Potsdam, Babelsberg Palace suddenly appeared next to us. With the sun shining and the wind blowing, we soon got hungry. Niklas fired up the boat's own barbecue and acted as grill master, while Sofia helped set the table. The small galley was well equipped with crockery, cutlery, glasses and even two hobs and pots. Shortly before Wannsee, we turned round, chugged back and anchored off the Hermannswerder peninsula. The children were keen to try out the SUP boards that are part of the boat's equipment. We adults tried it too, but I went for a swim. And while we were still paddling around, a cheeky duck spotted us, settled down on one of the boards and wouldn't leave our side. Swimming in the middle of the lake was unusual, but marvellous. And the sight of the well-filled lidos on the shore somehow left us with a feeling of exclusivity. Thanks to the help of the boat hire company, "parking" at the jetty went perfectly. The day was simply fantastic – we'll definitely do it again soon.

Boat rules for hobby skippers



Work before leisure

Commercial shipping always has always has right of way. Leisure craft must therefore give way. And giving way means passing the stern of the vessel that has right of way.

Muscles before engine

Motorboats must give way to without a motor (i.e. rowing and paddling boats) must give way.

Dodge sailors

A boat sailing under sail has right of way over motorised watercraft. However, if the sails are not hoisted, the boat is deemed to be a motorised vessel and must show due consideration.

Reduce wave impact

Motorboat drivers can cause lighter boats to capsize if travelling too fast. They should therefore always move with consideration and caution.

Dodge

...always to the right when two motorboats are approaching each other.

Right before left

As in road traffic, when two motorboats cross, the one coming from the right has right of way. However, this does not apply at a harbour exit: the person wishing to enter must wait for those coming out.



Towards the sun by steamer

A boat trip through the lake district between Werder (Havel) and Potsdam is the comfortable way to go sightseeing. Sitting comfortably on deck, passengers discover a new lakeside scenery around every bend.

The ship glides leisurely across the Havel, while on the Potsdam Palace and St Nicholas' Church come into view on the port side.




Watching a theatre classic on deck or dancing to pop songs with a delicious cocktail in your hand – an experience you won't soon forget in the evening sun.



All aboard!

The "Schiffahrt in Potsdam" (White Fleet) also operates in Werder (Havel) and Schwielowsee. In addition to classic tours such as the Havel Lakes Cruise and the Grand Island Cruise, which you can join in Werder (Havel) and Schwielowsee, the shipping company has come up with other unusual programmes, such as a castle cruise, the Wannsee Cruise, a pop party, the "Schiffsreigen unterm Feuerwerk", "Havel in Flammen" or culinary themed cruises, e.g. during the asparagus season.



The ship's horn sounds for a whole four seconds as we turn into the Caputher Gemeinde between Schwielowsee and Templer See coming from Werder's old town. This connecting canal used to be a small culvert, as 2nd skipper Max explains over the microphone. It was only widened for the transport of bricks. 22 trillion clay bricks were shipped from the Glindow brick-works to the capital during the Gründerzeit building boom in Berlin. The old Geltow railway station comes into view on the left, followed by the entrance to Lake Petzin. On the other side, framed by trees, Caputh Castle appears, its halls furnished with historical treasure..

Historical treasures ashore, an ice cream sundae on deck

"One strawberry punch!", the voice of a boat guest brings us back from the local past. Lake Templin opens up before us. A heron rises from a wooden pole, spreads its wings and flies in front of us like a pilot. The captain knows the route in his sleep. Since 2013, the "MS Bismarckhöhe" has been setting off three

times a day from its jetty next to the bridge to Werder's island town and embarking on a long journey. The owner family Kuhl organises round trips, day trips and evening trips - and always comes up with something new: for example, the theatre play "Fontane at Sea", which guests can watch on the upper deck. The "Schlager cruise", whose DJ plays music according to the passengers' wishes, is so popular that the team is now offering additional dates. The "Cocktail Cruise", the "14 Lakes Cruise", the "Excursion to Brandenburg" and the "Mulled Wine Cruise" in the run-up to Christmas are just as popular as the classic "Round Trip to Potsdam". A new addition to the programme is the "Excursion to Spandau" with a stop to explore the western corner of Berlin. And once a month, bridal couples can get married in a maritime atmosphere in the festively decorated bow saloon.

"We are completely individual," says Managing Director Patrick Kuhl, summarising the concept. By which he also refers to the food: The on-board bar offers regional products, from "Potsdamer Klosterbier" to homemade strawberry punch and award-winning wines from the traditional Werder-based company Lindicke. There is also a small selection of food, cakes and ice cream. "For the guests, the focus should be on enjoyment. If they leave the ship feeling relaxed, we've done everything right!"




Where will they
bite today?

Among connoisseurs, the Havel has long been a fishing paradise no longer an insider tip.

Bernd Lietz, 1st chairman of the Caputher Anglerverein, one of four angling clubs on Lake Schwielowsee, explains what fishing holidaymakers should know..

Mr Lietz, which are the best fishing spots in Werder and Schwielowsee are best for beginners?

In Werder, the shore areas are not freely accessible everywhere. Therefore, anglers usually need a boat. In Caputh, I can recommend both banks of the Gemünd between the ferry and the railway bridge. The two large car parks on either bank are particularly practical. You can catch peaceful fish here at any time of year and, with luck, a nice perch or an eel at dusk.

In predator fishing, a big catfish is a great success.

What is the challenge?

Firstly, the fact that catching a catfish is extremely rare. Out of a hundred anglers, only one has this luck in a lifetime. But four weeks ago, someone actually pulled out a big catfish here, even from the bank – the fish measured 1.68 metres. When you hook a fish like that, you need a strong rod and a decent reel with the right line. And several helpers to get the animal out of the water.

Which mistakes expose the beginner?

Simply going to the water with uninformed equipment that you have bought somewhere without any advice. The subject of fishing is just as complex as hunting law in the forest. And every federal state has different rules. It is essential to find out which authorisations are required to fish here at different times before you travel.

At what time do the fish bite best?

A good time is the change between day and night or night and day, i.e. dawn or dusk. Experience has shown that you have the best fishing luck in dim light.

And which baits do the Havel fish particularly like?

Fried fish love lumps of batter, i.e. a mixture of flour and water and a little butter, often with additives such as aniseed or vanilla. Every angler has their own recipes. Bream can be caught with tinned corn kernels. Dew worms, dung worms and maggots always work. Predatory fish can also be attracted by a worm. But artificial lures are more popular with them, such as small fish made of rubber or metal. A catfish is most likely to like a bundle of dewworms, a rubber fish or a shredded bait.

Fish-rich Havel

Some of the fish that anglers can hook in Werder and on Lake Schwielowsee – although rare species such as zander, pike and catfish can only be caught with a lot of luck.



The water hiking rest area directly by the old town island of Werder (Havel) and the one at the Märkisches Gildehaus in Caputh were classified by the ADAC with two steering wheels each for Technology & Service and Service and for Leisure & Supply.





Initially still with capstan and crank




The crossing of the Gemünd between Geltow and Caputh measures 80 meters. As a bridge was never built, the cable ferry "Tussy" has been transporting locals and tourists from shore to shore since 1853.

Initially with poles and oars, then with a guide rope, capstan and crank, and from 1928 by motor, the ferry transported horses and cattle, agricultural vehicles as well as fruit farmers' wives with their panniers and other pedestrians across the water. In the past, passengers who wanted to cross over from Geltow first had to call attention to themselves by ringing a large bell, but now the "Tussy II" travels back and forth almost continuously and is mostly occupied by cars. The night shifts were only discontinued when the gangway over the railroad bridge was installed in 1949.

Sauna raft

Inside, in the sauna cabin, enjoy the cozy warmth with changing views while the mist drifts over the water outside – a floating sauna makes it possible. From the Sanssouci campsite in Pirschheide, you can head out onto the Havel and relax with an infusion before cooling off in the lake.




Wakeboarding – full speed on the rope

On the shores of Lake Templin, near the Templin forest pool on the way from Caputh to Potsdam, wakeboarders whizz across the water along a two-mast system. Whether you are a beginner, advanced or professional, you can learn the basics or improve your skills here. The speed can be adjusted to suit individual learning needs. Many a person who once completed a beginners' course here now know the front flip like the back of their hand.

Every excursion here has a green light: the crowns of the oaks and Mark Brandenburg pines that line the paths shine brightly. The reeds on the banks where the reed warbler breeds. And the lush meadows where the horses blink at the sun as they relax and chew their cud. Let's go! The countryside is made for curious explorers.

Green Light

On an exploration tour

On foot, holidaymakers get to know the area particularly well. And don't forget to save a bit of stamina for the refreshment stop.



Walkers and hikers will find numerous rewarding day trips in Werder (Havel) and Schwielowsee. The **"Glindow Alps"**, former spoil heaps of the former brickworks that are now covered in greenery, are not high mountains and can therefore be conquered. Walls alternate with ravines, plateaus offer interesting views, forests and water holes provide a partly jungle-like nature experience. However, the hiker moves along well-maintained paths. You can start the tour at the car park in front of the Ziegeleiturm and follow one of the paths along the lakeshore all the way to Petzow.

The **Fontane hiking trail** follows in the footsteps of the famous writer along three lakes: Lake Templin, Lake Petzin and Lake Schwielow. A small bathing area awaits at Lake Petzin. While hikers follow the F6 trail markings, Brandenburg pines provide shade and traditional inns, some of which are listed buildings, invite you to stop for a bite to eat. The tourist information centre's Lauschtour app with Fontane's observations brings the writer's impressions to life. A break at the Museum of the Havelland Painters' Colony or the bonsai garden in Ferch provide further variety on the route, while at the southern end of Lake Schwielow those who have saved up enough stamina for a climb can enjoy an impressive view over the region: in the middle of the Ferch forest, on the **Wietkiekenberg**, you can actually "wiet kieken" from a 124 metre high viewing tower, namely over the entire length of the lake as far as Berlin.

F1 – around Templiner See and Schwielowsee


34 km/Path partly asphalted, gravelled or hard-packed forest floor



From Lake Templin, the route leads towards Potsdam city centre. The former royal seat not only impresses with its lavishly renovated buildings, but also with its waterfront areas close to the city centre. Following the "F1" signpost, you pass the Hermannswerder peninsula, which is worth a first detour with its detailed buildings from the beginning of the 20th century. The route continues through the former warehouse district, then over the Long Bridge with a view of the castle and St Nicholas' Church around the head of Lake Templin, before following the shore back southwards. A large area on this side of the lake is occupied by the Olympic training centre on the site of the old airship harbour.

Rowers, canoeists and swimmers train for their competitions in the lake and can be easily observed from the cycle path. In Geltow, at the foot of the Baumgarten bridge, a cosy old inn with a large garden area awaits for a long break with delicious home cooking. Here the Havel merges into Lake Schwielowsee, which the well-rested cyclists now begin to circumnavigate on the western bank. In Petzow, be sure to dismount, visit the Schinkel church and the former castle with the park designed by Lenné - and perhaps buy a freshly smoked trout for dinner. The route continues along the Caputher Gemeinde. The castle and church are worth a stop in the centre of Caputh. The route soon comes full circle, and if you like, you can round off the eventful tour at the Templin forest pool or in the beer garden opposite.

Cycle tours to interesting cultural assets on paths along the water:



Panorama trail „Werderobst“

16 km/Path mostly paved



The trail starts in Petzow with its old castle complex belonging to the von Kaehne landowning family. In the castle park, around the small Haussee lake, the fishing hut, the wash house and the old smithy are well worth seeing. The Schinkel church offers a beautiful view of Lake Glindow and the neighbouring sea buckthorn garden. The route continues northwards to Glindow. Here we recommend a stop at the brickworks museum with its old observation tower and the preserved historic ring kiln. If you prefer to stretch all fours, you can take a refreshing break at the Glindow lido and cool off in the lake. The trail turns west towards Elisabethhöhe and leads directly into the Werder (Havel) fruit-growing area with its cherry and apple orchards, which smell wonderful in spring and line the route with heavily hung branches in late summer. Then the farms tempt you to taste the fruit or the freshly harvested fruit processed into jam, juice and wine. If there is enough space on the pannier rack, guests can pick their own provisions from the branches for the rest of the tour. From the Telegraph Hill, you can see far across the landscape, a single white-pink cloud at blossom time. At the end of the route, in the village of Derwitz, the Lilienthal Memorial House and the Lilienthal Monument commemorate the ground-breaking flight attempts of this daring aviation pioneer.

Listening tour app

19 listening stations with stories and interviews



The municipality of Schwielowsee and the town of Werder (Havel) have developed a digital "listening tour" to the most important sights, which leads 33 kilometres from Caputh via Ferch, Petzow, Glindow, Werder (Havel) and Geltow back to Caputh. An audio commentary shows users who have activated the GPS function the way. Local experts provide interesting facts about each station – supplemented by Theodor Fontane's trenchant observations, which immortalised his travelogues.

Follow the current on the Havel cycle path

The route along the Havel is known as the "most beautiful river cycle path in the whole of Germany". Natural landscapes alternate with castles, monasteries, idyllic villages and culturally interesting towns. The water is always in view. The cycle path is well developed but emphasises nature. From Potsdam, the route leads via Geltow and Werder (Havel) to Branden-burg – a perfect one-day stage, from the end point of which the railway allows a relaxed return journey. www.havelradweg.eu

Free ride across the Zernsee!



The new foot and cycle path bridge over the Zernsee, which runs parallel to the railway bridge in the north of Werder, connects Werder (Havel) with Wildpark-West and thus creates a quick link to Potsdam's palaces and the city centre. The lightweight steel construction not only provides barrier-free access, but also an impressive view over the Havel and the Zernsee from two viewing platforms with seating areas.

Famous names

Werder (Havel) and Lake Schwielowsee were home to famous personalities at home:



Theodor Fontane (1819–1898)

He worked as a freelance writer and capitalised on the boom in travel literature. His five-volume work "Wanderungen durch die Mark Brandenburg", in which he describes castles, monasteries, places and landscapes in the region, cemented his reputation as an outstanding representative of poetic realism.

Otto Lilienthal (1848–1896)

The aviation pioneer was the first person to succeed in gliding through the air to glide through the air in a controlled manner. These experiments took place at a sand pit near Derwitz, today a district of Werder (Havel). He brought his "normal glider" to series production and founded the world's first aeroplane factory in Berlin.

Karl Hagemeister (1848–1933)

The son of a fruit grower from Werder proved to be a gifted painter and specialised in nature motifs in an impressionist and expressionist style. Together with colleagues, including Max Liebermann, he founded the art association "Berliner Secession". His home in Michaelisstraße on Werder's island can be recognised by a small plaque. He is buried in the island cemetery.

Christian Morgenstern (1871–1914)

The poet, writer and translator is known for his humorous poetry. His linguistic wit is particularly evident in his "gallows songs", which are said to have been written on the Galgenberg in Werder (Havel). To mark the 100th anniversary of Morgenstern's death, the Christian Morgenstern Literature Museum opened in the observation and museum tower of the Bismarckhöhe. The Christian Morgenstern Society is also based there.

Albert Einstein (1879–1955)

The scientist of Jewish descent is considered one of the most important physicists in the world and was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1921. In 1929, he had a summer house built in Caputh and spent most of his time there until he emigrated to the USA after the National Socialists seized power in 1933.

Gerhard Behrendt (1929–2006)

As a director and puppet designer, he created the character of the East German Sandman for German television in Berlin in 1959. His West Berlin namesake only went on air nine days later. Behrendt's birthplace in Caputh's Weberstraße (recognisable by an inscription on the side of the house) still stands today.

"We'll be back!"

The painter and gallery owner Peter Schrader from Dessau booked a holiday flat in the Havel region with his family:



"As we are extremely interested in art, we visited the exhibition in the Kunst-Geschoss on Werder-Insel and were impressed by the high standard of the exhibits. When it rained for a few days, we travelled to the museums and galleries in Potsdam and Berlin. The proximity to both cities is perfect for families – there's never a dull moment!"

The houses on the market square in Werder, renovated according to the town's renovation concept, the half-timbered church in Ferch and the church in Caputh, which is modelled on an Italian basilica church in Caputh are just some of the sights worth seeing in Werder (Havel) and Schwielowsee.



On the trail of winegrowers and fishermen's wives

In Werder (Havel) and on Lake Schwielowsee, holidaymakers can not only immerse themselves in the water, but also delve deep into the history of the region and its remarkable buildings.



The architect Konrad Wachsmann, who later worked with Walter Gropius in the USA, had designed Albert Einstein's summer house in an extremely minimalist style.



If the Schwielowsee holidaymakers hadn't been strolling along the shores of Caputh lake today, but in the early 1930s, they could have met Albert Einstein – on a walk with his wife Elsa or on the way to his sailing boat "Tümmeler", which was moored at the jetty below his house. Perhaps the Nobel Prize winner would have whistled a cheerful tune, because his slogan "Whistle at the world, come to Caputh!" was born of his love for this paradisiacal spot on earth. High above Lake Schwielowsee, he had a summer house built in the avant-garde functional style of the time, which he lived in almost all year round because he liked it so much. There is the richly decorated basilica in Caputh with its separate bell tower. Caputh Castle, the oldest surviving palace of the Great Elector in Potsdam's cultural landscape. The Ferch Fishermen's Church, whose ceiling painting is based on the clouds over Lake Schwielowsee and in which a baptismal angel is lowered from the ceiling during baptisms, which is believed to have once sailed the world's oceans as a figurehead.

A treasure chest full of stories, that still fascinate today

If you drive past the Schinkel church in Petzow, you are already on Werder soil. The soldier king once stationed a battalion on Werder's old town island. As the dilapidated island bridge would probably have collapsed under the troops marching at a brisk pace, the monarch had to replace the existing structure with a more stable version, much to his chagrin. The people of Werder would have advised him to let his soldiers cross the bridge in single file, but did they dare to do so? One can only guess. We do know that the old island mill burned down in 1973 because of children setting fire to it. Because the citizens were attached to their landmark, they quickly bought a second-hand mill and rebuilt it in Werder.

A tour of the island reveals more and more historical details: the steel bell next to the Heiliggeistkirche is a reminder of the replacement bells during the Second World War, when two of the three medieval bronze bells were to be melted down for war purposes, but later reappeared. Baderstraße was built on a slope so that the dirty water from the bathing parlours could flow into the Havel. The fishermen's wives waited in the "Kiegebüdchen" along the riverside promenade to be at the forefront when the catch was distributed. And why is the pavement on the island so uneven? Because the town's coffers were empty, the citizens were asked to lay the stones they had picked up between their vines. Today, visitors can follow in the footsteps of the rulers and churchmen, architects and craftsmen, farmers and fishermen who turned the region into a treasure trove of stories that still fascinate today.



Proven craftsmanship and artistic work are held in high regard in the region. A worker at the **Glindow brickworks manufactory** pounds up to seven tonnes of clay per shift into the brick moulds. The products are fired in the historic ring kiln. The Märkische Ziegeleimuseum right next to the manufactory guides visitors through the history of local brick production. Not far away, visitors can experience how the material is used in finer forms at **"Keramik&KulturGUT"**. On the market square in Werder (Havel), the **soap manufacturer "Sauber-kunst"** sells its body care products, which are purely vegan and made without palm oil and microplastics. Soap made from the protein-rich fleece of alpaca fur is available in the shop at the tourist information centre in Caputh and in the farm shop at **Werderaner Tannenhof**. In winter, knitted wool is also sold there, spun from the hair of the alpacas that live on the farm. Those who prefer to buy finished textiles should head to Geltow, where dish towels, table linen, curtains, clothing and yard goods are produced on looms, some of which are 300 years old, in listed buildings. The craftswomen of the **Geltow hand weaving mill**, which is the oldest in Germany, are happy to watch over their shoulders as they work or guide visitors who want to weave for themselves.

Dorado for art lovers

The region exerts a magnetic attraction on artists. In a monument to early industrial construction near Werder (Havel) railway station, the **Vulkan-fiberfabrik**, twelve representatives of the disciplines of sculpture, painting, photography and stage design form a joint studio with exhibitions, readings, concerts and theatre performances. "Fantastically realistic" are originals and prints from the **Inselatelier gallery** in Werder. The city gallery **KUNST-GESCHOSS** in the Schützenhaus presents international, national and regional art with a remarkable stylistic range. The **Schloss-galerie Haape** at Caputher Schlosspark organises exhibitions of paintings and sculptures by renowned creative artists. The **Waldgalerie Ferch** exhibits a wide variety of works on a path under the trees. The artists based in Schwielowsee and Werder (Havel) present their work together at events such as the **Open Studio Day**. The **Caputh Art Tour** also offers interested visitors the chance to get to know the local art scene in studios, private and public houses and in the castle.

Get creative yourself – inspiration as a holiday souvenir

Anyone who has wanted to develop their creative skills for a long time will finally find the time to do so on holiday in Havelland. Whether **weaving with willow rods**, making your own **mosaic**, trying your hand at **woodcutting**, **painting**, photo-realistic **drawing**, bringing discarded books to new life as sculptures, narrative **writing** or **experimenting with sounds** in the handbell choir: Throughout the year, unusual activities are organised especially for guests.

The **"KreativHerbst"** in Schwielowsee offers a treasure trove of ideas in October. Anyone interested can try their hand at artistic and perhaps discover something completely new in the process. The programme is available at:

There is always an occasion!

Guests sit on straw bales, the cuckoo calls and ducks quack as the sun sends its last rays over the lake. If you celebrate here, you get the scenery for free.



Blossoming cherry trees shelter the cheerful company, while fairground attractions and music stages provide entertainment. The tree blossom festival in Werder (Havel) was once launched to introduce Berliners to the local drops.



There is something going on here all year round. If you take a look at the calendar of local festivals, you will immediately get an overview of the most important attractions in the region:

The "**blossom town**" of Werder (Havel) has been celebrating the blossoming of its trees since 1879. Every year at the end of April, the fruit farms invite visitors to taste their wines and take a tour of their production. Then a veritable sea of white and pink blossoms spreads across the orchards, which can best be seen from high up on the Telegraphenberg on the Panoramaweg. Guests sit under the treetops in the middle of nature, with a slice of home-baked cake, often still warm from the oven, on their plate and a glass of fruit wine or organic juice in their hand. Apples, cherries and raspberries find their way into the yeast dough, and the numerous types of fruit wine are complemented by tasty beer creations, such as the popular Werderaner Kirschbier or blueberry and strawberry beer.

The **cherry and brick festival** is organized by the clubs of the Werderan district of Glindow. In midsummer, the festival meadow at the steamer landing stage is the venue for a whole weekend-long program, ranging from stage performances, sports tournaments and the traditional parade to live music and dancing. The highlight is the crowning of the Cherry Queen.



The municipality of Schwielowsee celebrates the village's historic cable ferry with the **ferry festival** in Caputh. On the banks of the Gemünd – the narrow waterway that connects Lake Templin with Lake Schwielowsee – visitors can enjoy culinary delights and various bands until the highlight of the festival, the big water ski show, begins. As the Caputh Preußen water ski club has already won numerous championships, spectators can look forward to a top-class performance.

A **White Festival** is a picnic where visitors come dressed all in white. Geltow, Ferch and Caputh, the districts of the municipality of Schwielowsee, provide their most beautiful backdrops for this. Guests enjoy the contents of their picnic baskets and the idyllic view from white-clothed tables on lakeside meadows and sometimes in front of Caputh Castle.

In August, locals and guests come together on the Mühlenberg in the island town of Werder, between the old town hall and the Bock windmill, for the annual **mill festival**. With Dixieland and rock music, the dance floor doesn't stay empty for long, and the food stalls provide a wide range of food and drink.

In mid-September, the castle park designed by Lenné at the Petzow wash house comes to life: That's when the Petzow Heritage Society invites you to the **Petzow Park Festival**. After the opening concert in the Schinkel Church, the festival continues with music, numerous outdoor activities for young and old and food from the "Petzow Washer-women".

The park festival is a welcome rest stop for those taking part in **Bike Sunday**, which takes place at the same time. The cycle route runs along the Havel and around Lake Schwielowsee, with an additional route via Werder (Havel), and is lined with culinary offerings and cultural interludes. A variety of music, exhibitions, demonstrations and freshly baked bread from the Ferch oven provide an extremely entertaining break from pedaling.

During the Advent weekends, it's worth taking a stroll through the various **Christmas markets**. They are all atmospheric, and yet the region offers some typical extras: In Caputh, for example, Santa Claus arrives in an illuminated inflatable boat, while the historic cable ferry is transformed into an open-air disco in the evening. Visitors to the Ferch Christmas market get together for a procession of minstrels and lanterns; on Werder Island, you can drink mulled fruit wine against the backdrop of the historic old town. Traditional crafts such as blacksmithing, wood carving and pottery characterize the offerings of many markets – which certainly contributes to the nostalgic flair, as do the countless lights that are reflected here and there in the Havel.

A look into the past

Four small, lovingly designed local history houses provide an insight into the history of the various villages around Lake Schwielow. In Glindow, the "sooty black kitchen", which has been preserved in its original state, is well worth a visit. The Petzow wash house has an exhibition on the history of Petzow, which was characterised by a manor house with a manor and the noble Kaehne family, as well as a second exhibition on the cultural history of laundry care. The Caputh Heritage House near the castle is furnished almost in the original style, with many items on loan and donations from local residents. After the tour, visitors can meet for coffee and cake in the idyllic courtyard. The 1000-year history of Geltow is being researched by the local history association, which presents its research in the clubhouse. Changing exhibitions, for example on the old craft of art casting, complement the information on offer, which the volunteers have organised with photos, pictures, books and everyday objects.



A facsimile of his guest book, an original recording of his voice and a computer simulation of the special theory of relativity based on a journey through the old town of Tübingen bring the famous son of the town back to life and make his outstanding scientific achievements understandable.

A separate section is dedicated to his wife and widow Margareta Morgenstern, the editor of many of his poems.

The "painters' village" of Ferch had been a centre of attraction for creative people, mainly from Berlin, since the end of the 19th century. It was the painter friends Karl Hagemeister and Carl Schuch who made it famous. In the village's last remaining farmhouse, which has been extensively renovated, the "Museum der Havelländischen Malerkolonie" (Museum of the Havelland Painters' Colony) presents various exhibitions of the most remarkable paintings and sculptures by the artists who captured the beauty of the Havelland forever.



Otto Lilienthal – Pioneer of the skies





In the green zone

The Märkische Golfclub Potsdam is located in the Werder district of Kemnitz, just a drive away from Lake Plessow. It is not only one of the largest training grounds in Germany, but also one of the most beautiful golf courses in the Berlin and Brandenburg region. Taster or advanced courses, beginners' lessons or professional rounds, youth golf or coaching for adults: on the 130 hectares of the "Märkische", everyone will find the offer that suits them best.

18-hole Fontane Course for ambitious golfers, a proven championship course, is the centrepiece of the facility. The 9-hole Lenné course is also a real challenge with its narrow fairways, small greens and numerous bunkers.

The 9-hole family course is ideal for beginners without a licence, but also for advanced golfers who will find a varied practice course here. The professional training area includes the large golf oval, up to 200 teeing grounds (18 of which are covered), four putting greens and a further two pitching greens.



"Crew to the boat!"

There is a lot going on on the Havel lakes during the sailing and rowing season. The Werder Sailing Association alone organizes three major regattas each year, including the "Havelpokal" and the "Werder City Prize". The Fercher sailing club invites you to a five-hour race on Lake Schwielow, which is no longer an insider tip among connoisseurs. On the regatta course in Werder (Havel), the arm of the river between the old town island and the mainland, the Werder Rowing Club organizes its competitions, such as the traditional Havel rowing regatta, but also championships and important qualification decisions. That was Werder (Havel) 2023 venue for the German Masters, the audience attracted all of Germany.



Tournaments in the equestrian village of Phöben



Three large horse farms in Phöben organize tournaments throughout the year, where external spectators are also welcome. Polo sport fans are recommended to check out the Phöben polo and equestrian center's calendar of events. At least one official DPV polo tournament is held on the two full-size playing fields every year, including the German championships. And if you get a taste for it: Polo taster courses are also on offer.



“Time out in Schwielowsee”

If you want to take a deep breath and allow your body and mind to relax, you should plan your Havelland vacation in spring.



During the “Time out in Schwielowsee” for eight weeks in April and May, healthy offers and energizing workshops on the topics of relaxation, exercise, nutrition and advice focus solely on well-being. The local health network offers everything that is good and inspiring: from massage to cooking together to stress management. Wherever possible, the meetings take place in nature. Because many refueling moments can be enjoyed even better in the most natural of all places of power: the lakeshore between water, beach and reeds.

Those with sporting ambitions might be interested in a completely new experience and try therapeutic climbing or slacklining. Whatever you choose, it will definitely prove to be a recovery booster.

As if the god of culinary delights had stumbled with his cornucopia and poured out all his gifts at once: The region boasts numerous delicacies fresh from the field or plantation, from the water or from the barrel. They are available directly from the producer or in idyllic cafés and Restaurants. So every stop here is a big icing on the cake!

Short distances to the table

When Werder (Havel) still belonged to Lehnin Monastery, the monks recognized viticulture as a worthwhile source of income. In 1740, Frederick II ascended the Prussian throne and immediately decreed that the people of Werder should make a meaningful contribution to feeding the population and grow fruit. They obeyed, but didn't want to give up wine-growing completely and planted the fruit trees between their vines. The region developed into the fruit chamber of Berlin and Potsdam, but is also known for its excellent wines – with the northernmost cultivated areas in Europe for quality wines.



On the **“Werderobst” panoramic trail**, which stretches twelve kilometers past small factories and farm shops, you can taste jams, vinegars, liqueurs and fruit wines fresh from the producer. Homemade honey is available everywhere, which the bees produce after their trips to the fruit trees. The vegetable farmers also reap rich harvests - the products from **Werder's ketchup factory** alone are valued nationwide for their sunny aroma. However, the city's oldest industry is fishing. Fischerstrasse on the Havel side of the island bears witness to Werder's first settlers. Even today, freshly caught fish specialties make restaurant guests' mouths water. If you prefer to eat at home, buy directly from the fishermen's smoker.

The top addresses for fans of fine dining are recommended: the **“Alte Überfahrt”**, awarded one star by the Michelin Guide, the **“Filterhaus”**, which Gault Millau ranks as one of the thousand best restaurants in Germany, and **“Fritz am Markt”**, which the “Feinschmecker” attests to a “radically regional cuisine”. High up on the Wachtelberg vineyard, the **“Weintiene”** offers award-winning wines and regional specialties as well as an impressive view over the Havel landscape. You no longer have to wish for “bon appetit”.



From trees and bushes straight into your mouth

For centuries, the people of Berlin have loved apples, cherries, pears, Plums and strawberries. At the time of reunification there were 16 million apple trees here. What makes the fruit from the region so special?

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Pruning fruit trees needs to be learned. Have over the centuries the people of Werder perfected their knowledge – in order to reap a rich harvest at the end of the season.

Mr. Kassin, Mr. Dr. Schmidt, why is the Werder location so exceptionally suitable for growing fruit and vegetables?

Walter Kassin: First of all, the hilly landscape with many south-facing slopes offers ideal conditions. But also the sandy soil, which warms up quickly when exposed to sunlight.

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: The many lakes also humidify and warm the air. Plants like high humidity. However, they have to make do with little rainfall here.

Walter Kassin: The moist air creates dew, which is sufficient for many plants. And it's amazing how deep some roots reach: fruit trees draw groundwater from a depth of five meters.

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: In some cases, wine has roots up to twelve meters deep!

How does the fruit and horticultural association preserve knowledge about regional fruit varieties and the tradition of fruit growing in Werder?

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: For example, we advise amateur allotment gardeners, invite you to training courses and lectures and introduce primary school students to gardening. The club also plants itself and cultivates mainly old varieties in the club's own gardens based on historical models.

Walter Kassin: In September we organize "Apple Day", where fruit growers present their varieties and invite you to taste them. When the pick-your-own begins, our club organizes a farm festival. Everyone is welcome and can eat their way through the current harvest to their heart's content and experience with all their senses what the farm-fresh, aromatic Werderobst is all about.

Which traditional apple varieties do you recommend to connoisseurs?

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: The Grafensteiner, a popular old variety, is very aromatic, a better clear apple that ripens rather early at the beginning of September.

Walter Kassin: The sour Boskoop is unsurpassed for baking cakes.

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: The Pinova is also extremely tasty. A smaller fruit perfect for children.

Walter Kassin: However, the old varieties do not store so well. They should be eaten or pressed into juice as soon as possible after harvesting.

Dr. Reinhard Schmidt: There are only around five to six apple varieties on the market worldwide. The Werder fruit growers, on the other hand, offer a wide variety. Today there are largely no wholesale markets in between; instead, producers sell to end consumers. Each has its own special varieties, which is how the wide range of products is created.

Tradition that is maintained

With the Werderaner Galgenberg, the Wachtelberg in Werder (Havel) and in Phöben and the Old Weinberg in Töplitz, there are still four vineyards on urban land today. There used to be far more, and winegrowing was one of the town's most important industries. In order to preserve the historical cultivation methods and make the quality of the local wines known, wine lovers founded the Werder Wine Association in 1995, to which three of the vineyards belong.

Home-grown grain, water from the company's own spring, matured in barrels specially made by a master cooper – the ambition that the producers put into their product melts in your mouth. A berry that has it all

Sea buckthorn is mainly known from the North and Baltic Sea coasts. Hardly anyone would suspect that one of Germany's leading sea buckthorn producers is based in Werder (Havel). In Petzow, a small town between Schwielowsee and Glindower See, the company owned by the Berger family (in the



picture managing director Dorothee Berger) grows sea buckthorn berries on 150 hectares under controlled organic conditions – and uses the fruits, which are rich in vital substances, to make juice, oil, jam, liqueur, and cosmetics numerous dishes that visitors enjoy in the café. After eating, those interested can explore the sea buckthorn garden with its farm shops.
